- 3.4 Details of the implementation of any particular exchange resulting from this MoU shall be negotiated between the two departments.





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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU) BETWEEN

THE ASSAM ROYAL GLOBAL UNIVERSITY AND

BARPETA GIRLS' COLLEGE

FOR

Collaboration in the field of Research, Training, Student and Faculty Exchange etc.

1. Preamble:

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is executed on this day, 12th December, 2023, between THE ASSAM ROYAL GLOBAL UNIVERSITY, a state private University, established by The Assam Royal Global University Act 2013 (to be read with The Assam Private Universities Act 2007), notified by the Government of Assam Gazette on 23/8/2013, herein after referred to as "FIRST PARTY/RGU", having its campus at Betkuchi, NH-37, Guwahati-781035, Assam. Starting its first academic session in July 2017, RGU currently offers multiple courses in diversified fields.

And

BARPETA GIRLS' COLLEGE, herein after referred to as "SECOND PARTY/Barpeta Girls' College", is a premier institution of higher learning (hereafter referred to as BGC), disseminating higher education at UG level among women folk and devotedly working for all round development of women by creating awareness of equal opportunity to women in every sphere of life with full dedication since its establishment in the year 1978. The college is located in an area which is dwelt on by the people of diverse caste, communities and ethnic groups. College address: P.O.:Barpeta, Dist.:Barpeta, Assam, PIN-781301

The Assam Royal Global University, Guwahati and Barpeta Girls' College are hereinafter collectively referred to as 'the Parties/Universities/Institutions' and individually as 'the Party/University/Institution'.

2. Purpose:

That the broad objective of this agreement is to have a common platform for Research / Faculty and Student Exchange Program/ Summer & Winter Internship/ Projects/ Joint Consultancy/ Joint Training Programs/ Effective implementation of NEP 2020 also considering issues related to NAAC, NIRF and UGC notifications on UTSAH and PoP etc. and other activities as agreed upon by both the parties.

3. Statement of Mutual Benefits & Interests:

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Page 2of 5

- 3.1 Together, these two parties shall work towards furthering cooperation in both education, training & academic research which will be mutually beneficial for both institutions.
- 3.2 Parties shall work in cooperation for research activities; joint training programs; exchange of faculty members; summer programs; student exchange; joint publications & sharing of information, etc. in addition to taking advantage of RGU's multi-disciplinary, inter-disciplinary, vocational degree thus, providing benefit to the students of the college under the NEP 2020 scenario.

4. Forms of Cooperation:

The Parties envisage the following cooperation within the scope of this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU):

4.1: Exchange of Faculty members

For planning and handling of academic programs and courses, organization of seminars, workshops and conferences including the exchange of mutual experiences in teaching, research, and industrial practices with prior approval from parent institutions. Honorarium, transportation, and accommodation/hospitality as per institution norms.

4.2: Exchange in Research

Through joint programs in research and development, including provision of Summer/Winter Internship Programme for the students of RGU and vice versa. During the period, either institution will provide hostel accommodation to the visiting students as per the institution norms. Prior approval and agreement of the head of the concerned department of the institutions is to be obtained to allow students to work in laboratories for projects, internships, etc. The Vice-Chancellor/Registrar/Principals of the universities/institutions will be the sole authority to grant final approval.

4.3: Joint Submission of Collaborative Projects

RGU faculty will involve some of the selected faculties of Barpeta Girls' College (depending upon their interest and expertise in a chosen domain) to be Co-investigators in their project proposals for funding and vice versa. Faculty members involved in any such projects will need to seek prior approval from respective Heads of the Institution.

4.4: Seminars / Symposia / Workshop/ Training Programs to be jointly organized

To jointly organize short-term continuing education programs, to organize seminars, conferences, training programs or workshops on topics of mutual interest, and invite faculty members from both the institutions to participate therein. However, for specific co-operation, projects shall be negotiated separately between the Parties and, in each specific case, shall be established as separate written agreements, stating the respective rights and obligations of the Parties.

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4.5 Co-Curricular activities (Sports, culture, debate, quiz etc.)

RGU and Barpeta Girls' College may conduct some Inter-University joint events, joint camps, training for specific sports etc. with mutual consultation.

5. Financial Obligations:

There will be no financial obligations on both the parties under this agreement.

6. General Coordinators:

Each party shall designate an administrative office/ department to oversee and facilitate the implementation of any agreements arising out of this MoU.

7. Intellectual Property Rights:

RGU and Barpeta Girls' College agree to respect each other's right to intellectual property. Further, all rights linked to ideas, inventions and patents generated during the MoU shall remain the common intellectual property of the Parties. The Parties shall not pass on or give usage rights of such property to any third party without the consent of the other party.

8. Dispute Settlement:

In the event of any dispute or difference arising under this Agreement, the Parties shall try to discuss and arrive at an amicable resolution thereof. If the Parties fail to arrive at an amicable resolution within (thirty) 30 days of the dispute having arisen, the matter shall be referred to arbitration by a single arbitrator appointed pursuant to the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The arbitral proceedings shall be held in Guwahati and the language of arbitration shall be English. The Parties agree that the decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on the Parties. The arbitration tribunal shall also decide on the costs of the arbitration procedure.

9. Liability:

Except for loss or damages caused through gross negligence or intent, the Parties shall have no liability to each other hereunder.

10. Force Majeure:

Neither party shall be held responsible for non-fulfilment of their respective obligations under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the force majeure events such as but not limited to eventualities like floods, earthquakes, strikes, bandhs, lockouts, epidemics, riots and commotions, etc. provided on the occurrence and cessation or cessation of such events, the party affected thereby shall give notice in writing to the other party within one month of such occurrence or cessation. If the force majeure conditions continue beyond four months, the parties shall then mutually decide about the future course of action.

11. Legal Relationship:

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Page 4of 5

This MoU shall be construed as a statement of purpose to promote a genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration between the Parties. Nothing in this MoU shall be constructed to create any legal relationship between the parties.

12. Coming into Force, Amendment and Termination:

This MoU shall come into force from the date of its signature and shall remain valid for a period of 5 years. This MoU may be modified, renewed or extended with the mutual written consent of the Parties. Either party may terminate this MoU by giving six (6) months' notice in writing to the other party.

(iii) TEAMLEASE EDTECH LTD., having its registered office at 903, Western Edge II, Western Express Highway, Borivali (E), Mumbai - 400066 and possessing ROC registration number U80301MH2010PTC211390 hereinafter called "Technology Service Provider" (which expression shall, unless it be repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, mean and include their administrators, successors in business and permitted assigns) or the 'Third Party' of the Other Part

Where as

- The Technology Service Provider is a Company incorporated under the Companies Act, I of 1956 and is engaged in the business of providing Education Support services for Educational HEIs and Universities.
- The HEI is a UGC approved HEI that has endeavoured to launch programmes that will create employable manpower, which is of crucial importance to the economy of the state and the country.
- The HEI is committed to make learning more effective by application of new technology and innovations. Further the HEI is committed to provide a wide range of professional and vocational Programs to meet the changing socioeconomic needs, with human values and purposeful social responsibility.
- The Technology Service Provider shall provide its services for all Programs offered by the HEI subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter recorded and agreed to between the parties.

The Program Manager shall provide program management for all Programs offered by the HEI subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter recorded and agreed to between the parties.

NOW THEREFORE, IN VIEW OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES AND CONSIDERATION SET OUT HEREIN, the Technology Service Provider and the HEI (each individually a "Party" hereto and collectively the "Parties") have agreed to enter into this Services Agreement ("Agreement") to govern the way in which the Technology Service Provider will provide Academic Support Services to all DA Programs offered by the HEI.

Scope of Agreement

1.1 Scope

This Agreement shall govern the provision of the Employability & Upskilling Services (Apprenticeship/Internship/Trainee/Employee) henceforth known as <u>'Special Services'</u> to Students who are admitted in existing Programs or new Degree Apprenticeship (DA) Programs (Degree, Diploma, Certificate Programs) by the HEI as per the Program Schedule. The Primary Service will include Special Services delivered to the student on behalf of the HEI by the Technology Service Provider & the Program Manager will handle the program management.

The Special Services will be provided to the HEI students in 2 Formats

- Format A Special Services for the Final Year Students
- Format B Launch of new Degree Apprenticeship (DA) Programs with Special Services

The responsibilities of each party are mentioned in **Annexure A**. The complete list of Programs intended to be covered by this Agreement is provided in **Annexure B** to this Agreement. The afore-mentioned list may be modified by mutual consent at any stage as may be required therein. The fees sharing arrangement between the parties is covered in **Annexure C**. The refund policy is covered in **Annexure D** to this agreement.

1.2 Commencement and Duration of this Agreement

This Agreement shall come into effect on the Effective Date and shall continue till the completion of an initial period of Five years. The Agreement may be renewed with written consent of both the parties for a further period unless either of the parties decides otherwise. In case, any one of the parties decides not to continue or renew the Agreement, the party shall be required to give a written notice to the other party of at least 90 days prior to the expiration of this Agreement.

1.3 Approvals and Required Consents

Each Party shall at all times and at its own expense (a) strictly comply with all Applicable Laws, now or hereafter in effect, relating to its performance of this Agreement; (b) pay all fees and other charges required by such Applicable Laws; (c) maintain in full force and effect all licenses, permits, authorizations, registrations and qualification from any Authority to the extent necessary to perform its obligations hereunder; and (d) Cooperate with each other to the fullest extent to fulfill the above mentioned requirements.

Breach & Rectification

In the event that either Party believes that the other is in material breach of its obligations under this Agreement, such aggrieved Party may

- Serve a Sixty (60) days' notice for curing this material breach. Any notice served pursuant to this Article shall give reasonable details of the Material Breach.
- ii. If the Material Breach is not rectified within this period of 60 days, the aggrieved Party will have the option to terminate the Agreement immediately.

1.4 Effect of Termination

On the termination of this Agreement as per the effective date aforesaid, the HEI shall stop the use of the Special Services & the Content and shall return the same to the Technology Service Provider forthwith, along with all documentation copies related to the Service. The Technology Service Provider will continue to service all enrolled students and the HEI will provide necessary support such as conducting exams and the issuing of certificates until the successful completion of the Programs they are admitted for as per the agreed-upon terms and conditions as provided therein. The Fee sharing for these set of students shall continue for this remaining extended period as per the Annexure C.

1.5 Dispute Resolution

This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of India. Any dispute or difference whatsoever arising between the parties to this Agreement out of or relating to the construction, meaning, scope, operation or effect of this Agreement or the validity of the breach thereof, which cannot be resolved through mutual discussions, shall be referred to a sole Arbitrator to be appointed by mutual consent of both the parties herein. In the event the Parties are unable to agree on who the sole arbitrator will be, the dispute shall be finally settled by a sole arbitrator, appointed pursuant to Section 11 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 will be applicable and the award made thereunder shall be final and binding upon the parties hereto, subject to legal remedies available under the law. Such differences shall be deemed to be a submission to arbitration under the Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, or of any modifications, Rules or re-enactments thereof. The Arbitration proceedings will be held at Guwahati, Assam. Each Party shall bear their own costs and expenses, incurred in connection with the arbitration proceedings.

Indemnification

Each Party shall indemnify and hold the other Parties harmless from third-party claims arising from or related to

- a) A breach of the terms of this Agreement; or
- b) A violation of any Applicable Law.

The foregoing is, however, conditional upon the aggrieved party ("Indemnified Party")

(i) notifying the party in breach ("Indemnifying Party") in writing and in detail without

- iii. it shall discharge its obligations under this Agreement with due skill, care and diligence.

The Program Manager warrants and represents to the HEI that:

- iv. it has full capacity and authority and all necessary approvals to enter into and to perform its obligations under this Agreement;
- v. this Agreement is executed by a duly authorized representative of the Program Manager;
- vi. it shall discharge its obligations under this Agreement with due skill, care and diligence.

The HEI warrants and represents to the Technology Service Provider and the Program Manager that:

- it has full capacity and authority and all necessary approvals to enter into and to perform its obligations under this Agreement;
- ii. this Agreement is executed by a duly authorized representative of the HEI;
- iii. it shall discharge its obligations under this Agreement with due skill, care and diligence.

1.7 Limitation of Liability

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary elsewhere contained in this Agreement between the parties, neither Party shall, in any event, regardless of the form of claim, be liable for any indirect, special, punitive, exemplary, speculative or consequential damages, including, but not limited to, any loss of use, loss of data, business interruption, and loss of income or profits, irrespective of whether it had advance notice of the possibility of any such damages

1.8 Force Majeure

Neither Party to this Agreement shall be liable to the other for any loss or damage which may be suffered by the other, due (directly/indirectly) to the extent and for the duration of any cause beyond the reasonable control of the Party unable to perform due to

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("Force Majeure") events such as but not limited to acts of God not confined to the premises of the Party claiming the Force Majeure, flood, drought, lightning or fire, earthquakes, strike, communal clashes, incidents of violence, lock-outs beyond its control, labour disturbance not caused at the instance of the Party claiming Force Majeure, acts of government or other competent authority, war, terrorist activities, military operations, riots, epidemics, civil commotions etc. No failure, delay or other default of any contractor or sub-contractor to either Party shall entitle such Party to claim Force Majeure under this Article.

The Party seeking to rely on Force Majeure shall promptly, within 2 days, notify the other Party of the occurrence of a Force Majeure event as a condition precedent to the availability of this defense with particulars detailed in writing to the other Party and shall demonstrate that it has and is taking all reasonable measures to mitigate the events of Force Majeure.

Intellectual Property

Each party owns, and will continue to own all rights, title and interests in and to any inventions however embodied, know how, works in any media, software, information, trade secrets, materials, property or proprietary interest that it owned prior to this Agreement, or that it created or acquired independently of its obligations pursuant to this Agreement (collectively, "Pre-existing Works"). All rights in Pre-existing Works not expressly transferred herein are reserved to the owner.

Specifically, all Intellectual Property created by the Technology Service Provider or its Partners at their cost is considered as Pre Existing Works and will continue to be the exclusive property of the Technology Service Provider. Content created and provided by the HEI will remain the exclusive property of the HEI, other than to the extent it has permitted use by the Technology Service Provider under this Agreement.

Miscellaneous

Independent Contractor - Personnel assigned by Technology Service Provider to perform the Services shall be employees of Technology Service Provider, and under no circumstances will such personnel be considered employees of the HEI. Technology Service Provider shall have the sole responsibility for supervision and control of its personnel. The personnel are under the direct control and disposal of the Technology Service Provider in respect of the execution of the services forming part of the responsibilities assigned to the Technology Service Provider. Technology Service Provider shall have the sole responsibility for payment of such personnel's entire compensation, including salary, withholding of income taxes and social security taxes, worker's compensation, employee and disability benefits and the like and shall be responsible for all employer obligations under all applicable laws.

Trademarks, Publicity - Neither Party may use the trademarks of the other Party without the prior written consent of the other Party. Except as required by law or the rules and regulations of each stock exchange upon which the securities of one of the Parties is listed, neither Party shall publish or permit to be published either along or in conjunction with any other person any press release, information, article, photograph, Principal College.

illustration or any other material of whatever kind relating to this Agreement without prior reference to and approval in writing from the other Party, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

Assignment – This Agreement and the rights and obligations contained herein may not be assigned by either Party without the written consent of the other Party.

Severability - If any provision of this Agreement, or any part thereof, shall be found by any court or administrative body of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, the illegality, invalidity or unenforceability of such provision or part provision shall not affect the other provisions of this Agreement or the remainder of the provisions in question, which shall remain in full force and effect. The relevant Parties shall negotiate in good faith in order to agree to substitute for any illegal, invalid or unenforceable provision a valid and enforceable provision, which achieves to the greatest extent possible the economic, legal and commercial objectives of the illegal, invalid or unenforceable provision or part provision.

Delays or Omissions - No delay or omission to exercise any right, power or remedy accruing to any Party, upon any breach or default of any Party hereto under this Agreement, shall impair any such right, power or remedy of any Party nor shall it be construed to be a waiver of any such breach or default, or an acquiescence therein, or of any similar breach or default thereafter occurring; nor shall any waiver of any other breach or default theretofore or thereafter occurring. Any waiver, permit, consent or approval of any kind or character on the part of any Party of any breach of default under this Agreement or any waiver on the part of any Party of any provisions or conditions of this Agreement, must be in writing and shall be effective only to the extent specifically set forth in such writing. All remedies, either under this in the Agreement, or by law or otherwise afforded to any Party shall be cumulative and not alternative.

Compliance with Laws & Regulations - Each Party to this Agreement accepts that its individual conduct shall (to the extent applicable to it) at all times comply with all Applicable Law. For the avoidance of doubt the obligations of the Parties to this Agreement are subject to their respective compliance with all Applicable Law.

Entire Agreement - This Agreement and all schedules appended thereto constitute the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to their subject matter, and as to all other representations, understandings or agreements which are not fully expressed herein.

Survivability - The termination or expiry of this Agreement for any reason shall not affect or prejudice any terms of this Agreement, or the rights of the Parties under them which are either expressly or by implication intended to come into effect or continue in effect after such expiry or termination.

Amendment - The Parties acknowledge and agree that amendment to this agreement shall be made in writing. Any such amendment made in writing shall be binding upon the Parties.

Full Refund

Girijananda Chowdhury University, Hathkhowapara, Azara, Guwahati, Assam 781017, a private university established in accordance with the provisions of the Assam Private Universities Act, 2007, (Assam Legislative Act XLVII (47) of 2022) and approved by the UGC; through the Vice-Chancellor/Registrar, of the One Part

AND

Barpeta Girls' College, a college provincialized by the Govt. of Assam in the year 2005, through the Principal of the college, of the Other Part.

WHEREAS the Girijananda Chowdhury University (hereinafter referred to as GCU) is a reputed University in India providing higher education in most of the branches of knowledge, besides excelling in research in various disciplines in Science, Technology, Humanities, Management and Commerce Streams, in addition to being a pioneer institution in innovating new ideas in education.

AND WHEREAS the Barpeta Girls' College (hereinafter referred to as BGC), a premier college of Barpeta district disseminating higher education among women of this locality with full dedication since its establishment in the year 1978.

WHEREAS the Girijananda Chowdhury University and the Barpeta Girls' College are willing to cooperate in the promotion of teaching, research, and innovation, desire to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding for the purpose of fulfilling their objectives in a better way.

1. SCOPE OF COOPERATION:

- 1.1 The activities to be carried out under this cooperation shall include:
 - exchange of students

 - exchange of academic information and publications

 - joint organization of conferences, seminars, workshops, etc.

- 2.1 Unless otherwise agreed to, all rights and title to Intellectual Property, whether or not patentable, conceived and reduced to practice, in the performance of the activities under this MOU, exclusively by an employee of any two universities/organizations shall be owned by that university/organization.
- 2.2 All rights and title to Intellectual Property whether or not patentable, conceived and reduced to practice jointly by employees of both universities/organizations shall be jointly owned. Neither University shall use or license to any third party such jointly owned intellectual property for any purpose, whatsoever, without prior written consent of the other university/organization.

3. COORDINATION COMMITTEE:

- 3.1 There will be a Co-ordination Committee for effective execution of the activities to be carried out under this MOU and for reviewing their progress. The composition of this Committee will be as follows:
- 3.2 A Senior Faculty member of the Girijananda Chowdhury University nominated by the Vice-Chancellor, will be Coordinator of the activity.
- 3.3 One Joint Coordinator nominated by the Vice-Chancellor of Girijananda Chowdhury University.
- 3.4 One member nominated by the Vice-Chancellor of the Girijananda Chowdhury University.
- 3.5 The Committee shall submit a written report of the progress of the activities to be carried out under this MOU to each Party, annually, together with any suggestions for improvements.
- 3.6 A similar committee shall be formed by the other university/organization.

4. <u>CONFIDENTIALITY:</u>

The parties agree that the ownership of and any other rights relating to intellectual property arising from or in connection with any program or activity under this Memorandum of Understanding shall be determined on a case by case basis, and shall therefore be specified and agreed for each such program or activity in a separate written agreement between the parties.

5. EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION OF THE MOU:

This MOU shall be effective from the date it is signed by the parties hereto. The duration of the MOU will be initially for a period of 03 (three) years from the effective date, unless or otherwise terminated earlier, as per Clause 6.

6. AMENDMENT TO MOU:

No amendment to this MOU shall be valid unless the same is made in writing jointly by the parties hereto or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be an amendment to this MOU.

7. TERMINATION OF MOU:

- 7.1 The MOU can be terminated by either party giving the other party, a prior written notice of not less than ninety days of its intention to do so, but without dishonoring any commitment entered into prior to the date of termination notice.
- 7.2 This MOU shall also stand terminated for any reason such as legal processes, Acts of the State or similar such exigencies beyond the normal control of the party concerned and which disabled any of the parties hereto from functioning further.
- 7.3 Despite termination, the parties shall abide by the usual professional ethics and normal code of conduct to maintain the confidentiality of the information and intellectual property rights.

8. DISPUTE RESOLUTION:

Any dispute arising under the terms and conditions of this MOU shall be referred to a competent independent Arbitrator as agreed to by both the Institutions.

9. Force Majeure:

For the purpose of this MOU the expression *Force Majeure* shall mean any clause affecting the performance of a party of its obligations arising from the acts, events, omissions, happenings, or non-happenings, beyond its reasonable control including (but without limiting the generality thereof) government regulations, fire, flood, earthquakes, strikes, or any other disaster or an industrial dispute, affecting a third party for which a substitute third party is not reasonably available. Any act, event, omission, happening, or non-happening will be considered *Force Majeure*, if it is not attributed to willful act, neglect or failure to take reasonable precautions of the affected party. Neither party shall whatsoever, including but not limited to any damage or

abetment of charges whatever directly or indirectly caused to or incurred by the other party by reason of any failure or delaying the performance of its obligation hereunder which is due *Force Majeure*. Notwithstanding the foregoing, each party shall use all reasonable endeavors to continue to perform or resume the performance of such obligations hereunder for the duration of such *Force Majeure* event.







- 3. THAT users can request various kinds of resources; the most common are books or chapters of books, journal articles, reports, audios & videos etc.
- 4.THAT each participating library should keep record of every transaction of INTER-LIBRARY LOAN.
- 5. THAT the decision to lend materials is always discretion of the LENDING LIBRARY. The Lending Library's policy and procedures must be adhered to.
- 6. THAT the duration of the loan is set by mutual consent. It can vary from library to library.
- 7. THAT official request should go through Lending Library's preferred format.
- THAT the Lending Library receiving request from Borrowing Library should deal with them as quickly as possible. When a request can not satisfied, and then the Borrowing Library should be notified immediately.
- 9. THAT Borrowing Library should provide its own means to pick up from and returns materials to the Lending Library.
- 10. THAT this MoU is on reciprocal basis, between both libraries. The Lending Library will bear all responsibilities, in case of forward/return delivery/postage costs; overdue fines; security of and loss or damage to the borrowed item(s).
- 11. THAT charging procedures should be simple and efficient or mostly free of cost. The Lending Library should make information on their charging procedures and current charges readily available to the Borrowing Library.
- THAT the Borrowing Library should ensure items are returned on time and respect any special conditions imposed.
